June was a month of inspiration at Uptown Civitan. On June 12, we were pleased to have David McGowan, president and CEO of WJCT, our local public TV station and National Public Radio affiliate in Jacksonville. He also brought Jenny Burkhalter, donor manager at WJCT and daughter

of Gayle Kanak and granddaughter of Mattie Fraser. Mr. McGowan has spent the last 20 years in Europe in private cable and telecom organizations pioneering digital platforms. He shared with us the work he's doing on the 'digital catch up' in public broadcasting in Jacksonville. He has a focus on radio reading, the digital convergys alliance and the annual TEACH event that helps to inspire teachers to reach kids in a new age. He spoke of the changing landscape in public radio and how he is involved in planning in and around the location to keep WJCT relevant and in the mix. It was fascinating to hear how Europeans approach to public radio/television as compared to the U.S. He has plans to see WJCT and its legacy programing along with innovative ideas continue to play a large role in our community. barriers of poverty. She has 15 years in teaching and mentoring to help her achieve this goal. Working out of her car, her house, whatever is needed, she is making this happen. The Giving Closet Project is working to give students a clean fresh set of clothes weekly, taking in laundry and returning to the schools. One source of these clothes is the lost and found departments at local schools. Opportunities for other donations, sponsorship and volunteer efforts are available. She shared her story and was so moved by the leaders of North Florida School for Special Education that a beautiful hand made glass art piece created by a student at the North Florida School of Special Education, was pre-
